MEET THE MOUAS

Zong began his pastoral ministry in 2012 as the English Minister at Antioch Baptist Church in Colorado while attending Denver Seminary. In 2014, he earned his Master of Arts in Youth and Family Ministries and married his wife, Bai. Together, they returned to Spokane, Washington, where Zong served alongside his father, Pastor Vang Moua, at Spokane Hmong Alliance Church.

In 2015, Zong accepted the call to serve at Yuba Sutter Hmong Alliance Church, first as Associate Pastor and, a year later, as Interim Senior Pastor. In 2018, Zong accepted the call to plant a Hmong-American church in Sacramento, California under the Hmong Baptist National Association of the SBC. He was ordained in 2021.

Zong and Bai are blessed with five children, whom they homeschool. As a family, they enjoy going for walks and spending time with their church community.

THE HISTORY OF GRACE RIVER CITY CHURCH

Grace River City Church (GRCC) is the first Hmong-American, confessional Reformed Baptist church in the history of Hmong Christianity. The church plant began in the spring of 2018 when Pastor Zong Moua contacted Dr. Tra Xiong of the Hmong Baptist National Association and accepted the call to plant the only Hmong Southern Baptist church in Sacramento, California.

It began as a home Bible study and officially launched at the start of 2020 at its sending church's facility, Pleasant Grove Baptist Church. At the end of 2020, the congregation moved to north Sacramento to gather for worship at Cornerstone Bible Church.

From 2021 to 2023, GRCC focused on planting the church through discipleship and evangelism. However, near the end of 2023, the church experienced a significant loss when half of its membership resigned due to doctrinal differences and fatigue. This led GRCC to regroup back into the home at the start of 2024.

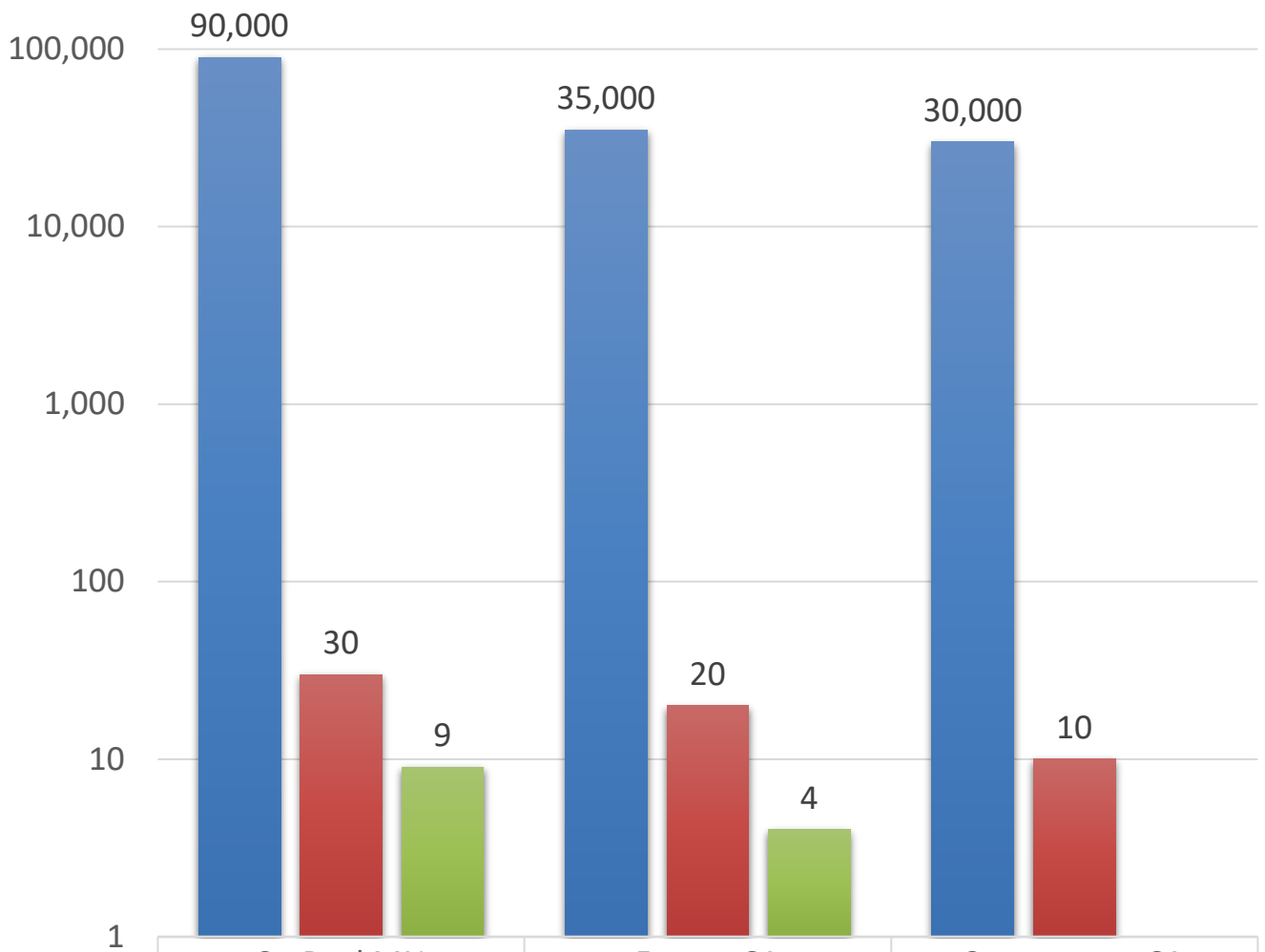
From 2024 to 2025, GRCC has been faithfully rebuilding a new core group with a new vision and mission. In 2026, by God's grace, the church anticipates moved into a new facility and officially relaunched the church plant with a new zeal to reach the lost for Christ.



WHY SACRAMENTO?

Sacramento ranks as the 3rd* highest Hmong populated city in the United States, yet there are no Southern Baptist Hmong churches.

Note: As of 2025, there is only one other 1689 Hmong church plant in the world.

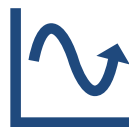
